History

Govt. Kamla Raja Girls Post Graduate Autonomous College, Gwalior, established in 1937, is a pioneer and top institution for women in higher education in this region of the Madhya Pradesh. It was upgraded to the postgraduate level in 1970 and granted autonomous status in 1995. The College is housed in one of the palaces from the former Scindhia dynasty, which stands with regal grandeur in the center of the city. Its main structure, the impressively old Saraswati Mahal, is surrounded by recently built blocks of various faculties, picturesque natural beauty, lovely



green grass, and tall trees. It is a unique college with both old and new buildings and breathtaking natural beauty spread throughout a sizable campus of 53714.60 square meters.

National Assessment & Accreditation council, Bangalore (NAAC) has accredited this college as B level) among autonomous colleges in 2002. During reaccreditation process by NAAC in 2010, college was again accredited by B grade. In the third cycle of NAAC reaccreditation, college has been upgraded as A grade College in 2016.
