Participation in this program is being carried out through the Government KRG, Girls Post Graduate Autonomus College, Gwalior. The NSS plays a vital role in nurturing moral values, discipline, and a spirit of service among students. It not only supports their personal development but also cultivates leadership qualities and a sense of responsibility. The New Education Policy (2020) has recognized the importance of NSS by including it as an elective course. Through their involvement in NSS, students develop qualities of social service, empathy, and a commitment to serve the community selflessly. One of the key components of NSS is the organization of a seven-day special residential camp each year, where students stay in rural or underdeveloped areas. During these camps, they engage with the local community, identify social problems, and work collectively to find meaningful solutions. This hands-on experience enhances their understanding of real-life issues and prepares them to contribute positively to society.

To promote social participation on various issues such as national unity, afforestation, equality, cleanliness awareness, environmental conservation, accident awareness, traffic rules, child welfare, etc., different activities and awareness campaigns are organized. Along with these, students actively participate in activities like shramdaan (voluntary labour), blood donation, HIV/AIDS awareness, and literacy drives. Through these efforts, students contribute significantly as responsible members of society.

Along with this, approximately 30 volunteers from the institution participated in the National Unity Camp, and 50 volunteers took part in the State-Level Camps. Around 10 volunteers participated in the State Republic Day Camp. Additionally, in the Pre-Republic Day Parade Camp and Republic Day Parade Camp held in New Delhi at the Kartavya Path, around 5 volunteers proudly represented the institution.
